1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies adopted by the Company are as follows:

1.1 Basis of preparation

Ervia Finance Public Limited Company ('the Company') is a limited company incorporated in Ireland. The ultimate parent undertaking is Ervia. The Company's registered office is Webworks, Eglinton Street, Cork. The Company did not trade during the year.

The financial statements are presented in euro and are prepared on a historical cost basis.

i. Statement of Compliance:

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS') as adopted by the EU ('EU IFRS'), International Financial Reporting Interpretations Committee ('IFRIC') and in accordance with the Companies Act 2014.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with those IFRS standards and IFRIC interpretations issued and effective for accounting periods ending on or before 31 December 2016.

ii. Use of estimates and judgements:

The preparation of the financial statements, in conforming with IFRS, requires the use of judgements, estimates and assumptions in determining the value of assets and liabilities, income and expenses recorded for the period, and positive and negative contingencies at year end. Actual results in future financial statements may differ from current estimates due to changes in these assumptions or economic conditions.

There are no critical accounting judgements made in the preparation of the Company's financial statements.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which these estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

iii. Going Concern:

The company has ceased trading and the intention is to wind up the company since the balance sheet date. The financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than that of a going concern. The financial statements do not include any provision for the future costs of terminating the business of the company except to the extent that such were committed at the balance sheet date.

This new standard will replace IAS 17 Leases (and associated interpretative guidance), and offers a new comprehensive model for the identification of lease arrangements and their treatment in the financial statements of both lessees and lessors.

The most significant change will be to lessee accounting, where the distinction between operating and finance leases is removed, and will effectively bring onto the balance sheet the accounting for assets and liabilities associated with operating leases. There will be no significant changes in respect of lessor accounting.

4. RISK MANAGEMENT

The financial risk management of the Company is fully integrated with the risk management function of the Group. The Directors consider that the Company's business is not exposed to any foreign exchange risk, market risk or liquidity risk. The Company's income and operating cash flows are substantially independent of changes in market interest rates.
